

Mind's Eye

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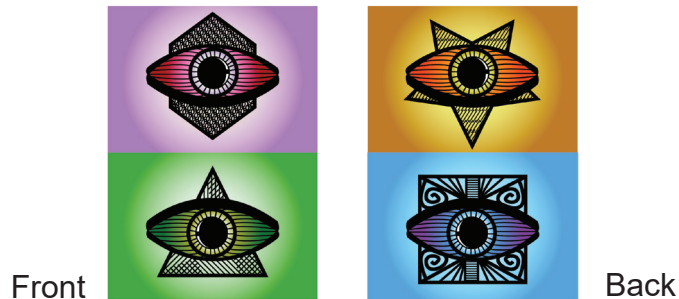
2-3 player | ages 10+ | 15-20min

Overview

Mind's Eye is a 2-3 player staring contest game made of 18 identical cards.

Contents

18 Identical Cards
1 Rulebook



Object of The Game

Players simultaneously play a single card pointing the colored eyes they wish to use towards the other player(s). Winners will take the losers cards based on the color of the eye. Play until all the cards are in one player's hands. That player is now the winner.

Set Up

- In a **2-player** game give each player **9 cards** to begin.
- In a **3-player** game give each player **6 cards** to begin.

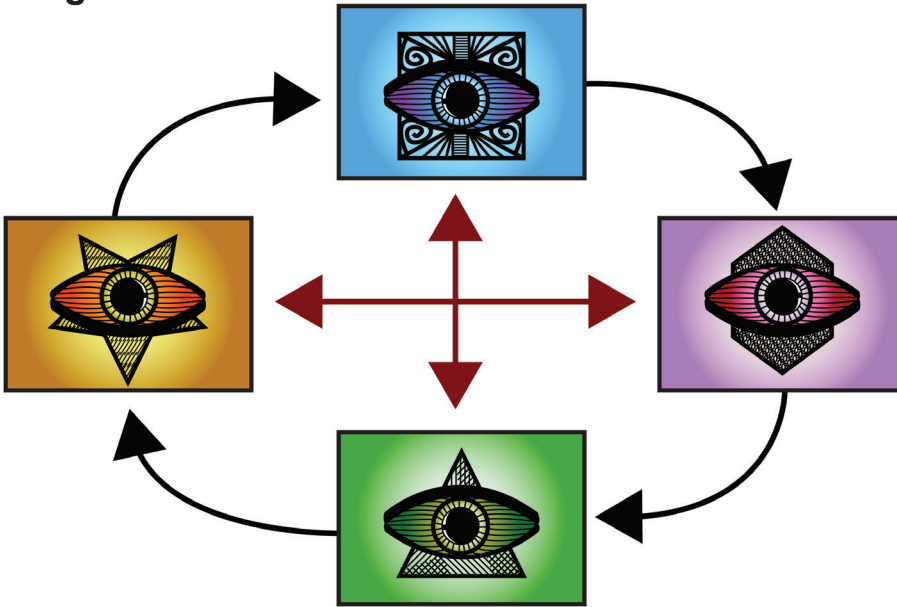
How to Play

1. Choose which of the four eye colors you are going to play. Keep the choice concealed until you're ready to play.
 - Everyone counts down "3, 2, 1 Mind's Eye", **simultaneously playing a card** making sure the eyes point to the other player(s).
 - Depending on the color played, the winner takes the card(s). Reference the *diagram* and *examples of game play* to determine the winner.
2. If two players play the **same color eye** at each other, this initiates a **staring contest**. If there is a third player, they will be the judge. Both players involved put their cards aside and stare into each other's eyes.
 - First person to blink loses.
 - You cannot break eye contact.
 - Touching is not allowed.
 - Blowing into another person's eyes are not allowed.
3. If your colored eyes are **across** each other on the diagram they are **discarded** from the game.
 - The only exception is in a three-player game. If one player has won a card it is now theirs and the other remaining card would be out of the game. See *examples of game play* for more information.
4. Play until one player has all the cards.

The End

When one player has collected all the cards in the game, they are declared the winner!

Diagram



Winning Combinations:

- Blue beats Purple
- Purple beats Green
- Green beats Orange
- Orange beats Blue
-

Cards are Removed from the Game when these happen:

- Blue and Green cancel each other out
- Orange and Purple cancel each other out

Examples of Game Play

What Happened:

- Orange beats Blue (All Players)

Result:

- Everyone won and was beat by someone so all cards are removed from the game

What Happened:

- Green (Player 1) beats Orange (Player 3)
- Purple (Player 1) and Orange (Player 2) Cancel Out
- Blue (Player 2) and Blue Tie (Players 3)

Result:

- Since Green beat Orange and they are not apart of the tie Player 1 takes Player 2's card and no staring contest happens
- Player 3's card is removed from the game

What Happened:

- Purple (Player 1) and Orange (Player 2) Cancel Out
- Orange (Player 2) beats Blue (Player 3)
- Green (Player 1) and Blue (Player 2) Cancel Out

Result:

- Player 2 gets Player 3's card and keeps their card for winning
- Player 1's card is removed from the game

2 **3**

What Happened:

- Purple (Player 2) beats Green (Player 3)
- Purple (Player 1) and Purple (Player 3) tie
- Green (Player 1) and Green (Players 2) tie

Result:

- The person who wins will always go before a tie. So Player 2 claims Player 3's card.
- But since Player 2 is tied with Player 1 they will do a staring contest and the winner will win all three cards.
